Questions 31-34 are based on the following passage.

Indiana Jones, the swashbuckling fictional adventurer, would seem to have nothing on John Goddard. As a boy (A) in Los Angeles, Goddard dreamed of adventures in faraway lands and spent his life pursuing an elaborate set of goals. He wanted to climb the most perilous peaks, navigate major rivers and explore the most remote regions, among many other ambitions. "When he was young, he heard older people say with regret that they hadn't done the things they wanted to do," his son said. "He decided he was going to live a life of adventure so he wouldn't have any regrets." Armed with that determination, Goddard sat in his bedroom one day when he was 15 and jotted down his 127 goals, inspired by his avid reading of the Encyclopedia Britannica and numerous adventure stories. Goddard, an adventurer, explorer and lecturer, who evidently fell only a few goals short of his boyhood list, died Friday at a Glendale hospital of complications from cancer. He was 88.

Among the attempts to solve education problems, financial incentives for teachers have become more common in recent years. (A), the concept of merit pay has resulted in disagreement; opponents argue that home and community factors that affect student performance make it impossible to introduce a fair system. Linking teacher bonuses to standardized-test scores has been especially **contentious**. Motivating students with money has also been on the rise. In 2008 *USA Today* reported that at least a dozen states planned to pay students—most with money from corporate and philanthropic donations—for meeting class-work or test-score standards. (B), experiments have found that paying students not for meeting performance expectations but for fundamental actions common to academic success—good behavior, regular attendance, homework completion—produces better results.

Depression is more than just feeling a bit down or overwhelmed; at its worst, it is a debilitating illness, leaving its sufferers unable to sleep or eat and filled with feelings of immense sadness and guilt. It is sometimes thought of as a modern affliction, a result of the rich world's leisurely preoccupation with the self. But that couldn't be (A) from the truth. Depression was once referred to as 'melancholia', a diagnosis recorded around the 5th century BC by philosophers like Hippocrates. Arateus described symptoms that sound all too familiar to modern clinicians: 'The patients become dull or stern, dejected or unreasonably torpid ... they also become peevish, dispirited and start up from a disturbed sleep'. Depression is a reality for people in the developing world, too: one survey of Aids-stricken regions in Uganda showed that 21 percent of residents were clinically depressed, while studies in a Pakistani village showed that 44 percent of the population were suffering from some kind of depressive disorder.
